First timer's impressions of NDTA

This year's NDTA was a very special event for Monique and Echo, for whom this was their first competition at the official Dogs NZ Obedience Level (Beginner) and the first time participating in a nation-wide dog obedience competition. Monique and Echo came 4th in their test on 23 October, and their performance in the ring was inspiring. Congratulations to Monique and Echo! Tailwagger asked Monique to share her impressions of the event with our readers.

It's been a long few days. On the 18th of October, the marathon that was the National Dog Training Show started.

I started on **Day 2** (19th Oct) with assisting in the Working Trials. I laid 2 tracks and was supposed to lay a third when I fell in the ditch much to the amusement of everyone there. The amazing Leesa took me to her house and cleaned me up and it was easier to laugh about when I was clean.

Day 3 (20th Oct) was the start of Obedience Show 1. I assisted with moving a lot of dog food. I had some time to take Echo into the rings to get used to the area as she had never competed indoors before. The day also involved some set up and the welcome. The welcome included the presentation of working trials where I was given a special prize for falling in a ditch. It was an amazing dog training vest.



Day 4 (21st Oct) was Teams Event and finishing the show from the first day. I had the runners job for the event where I took scores from the judge to the scoreboard so everyone could see.

Day 5 (22nd Oct) was Obedience Show 2, and I assisted with Hot scent and Stay stewarding for Test C and helped (a small amount) to set up for the party that night.



Day 6 (23rd Oct) was the final Obedience Show (number 3) and my turn to compete. I could not have been happier with how our heelwork went. First time doing on-lead and off-lead with Echo, and she was not going to go say hello to the judge or steward (as she likes to do). I was holding back my excitement so I didn't hype her up too much. Lots of cuddles after the recall (which had some problems⁽²⁾). She did her stays, then we did a run-off as well. It was my first run-off, and it was a learning curve (and we'll leave it at that ⁽²⁾). I was very proud when I was called up for 4th on 72.5 points out of 75. I was on challenge points and only lost 0.5 in my on-lead heelwork and 0.5 in the off-lead heelwork.

It was an amazing event, and I got to watch some amazing people and cheer them on as they competed and did well. Congratulations to everyone who placed!!!

I am so thankful to so many people who helped me get to this point. Tanya, Anthea, and Cushla have been my instructors from the beginning and each have given me so much to think about. I want to thank you all so much for the support

throughout the weekend and before. Especially for reminding me to think of how far I've come.

Recipes to try: Summer treats for your dog

With summer and the warmer weather coming, it is important that your dog does not get overheated. This may make you wonder "What can I give my pup to cool down?" There are many fun treats that you can make at home for your dog to keep him cool and happy!

Before heading to the kitchen, there are a few ingredients you should always avoid when making treats for your pets. NEVER put xylitol (an artificial sweetener that can sometimes be found in peanut butter), raisins, grapes, or chocolate in your dogs' treats!

Remember, give treats in moderation to avoid excessive calories. Pet owners should also know that eating a large amount of food too fast can lead to bloating and abdominal pain. Also, some dogs can be very sensitive to eating new things like yogurt and this can lead to upset stomach (vomiting and diarrhea). Any concerns about your pet's health should be addressed with your family veterinarian. If you are not sure that your dog will be fine with the ingredients of homemade dog treat recipes, please consult with your veterinarian before giving treats to your dog to keep them safe.

Here are two recipes that your dog will enjoy.

Peanut Butter and Fruit Freezies



Ingredients:

1 cup berries (strawberries, blueberries or raspberries) ¹/₄ cup water A few tablespoons of peanut butter that doesn't contain xylitol (check the label!)

Method:

Wash and clean fruit (cut tops off strawberries) Puree fruit in a blender with water Place fruit puree in an ice cube tray or silicone mold, filling ³/₄ of the way Add a small amount of peanut butter to each mold Freeze until completely frozen.

Frozen Kong

A Kong toy can provide hours of entertainment for a dog and it can be filled with many different types of ingredients. Pre-made cheese-like products or peanut butter can be used to fill the Kong and then freeze, or you can make your own delicious mixture! Here are some examples.

Cheese Kong:

1 cup of boiled potato, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup plain cottage cheese, $\frac{1}{2}$ cup low-fat cheese

Fruit Kong:

1 banana, 1 cup yogurt, 1 tsp. honey Chicken and carrot Kong:

1 cup cooked sweet potato, handful of shredded, boiled chicken, handful of cooked carrots, 1 tbsp. yogurt.
